- Able to facilitate and deliver Cultural Engagement programs.

- Knowledge of the Aboriginal Community
- Understanding and knowledge of: community, government and non-government service providers and support programs.

The successful applicant will work across a targeted number of schools within the South Coast Network. The Project Officer will be an employee of the NSW AECG INC. and will work in collaboration with the Pirru Thangkurray (Dream Strong) Cultural Engagement and Goal Setting Team.
